One card will have a picture or drawing, the other will have a clue to describe it, for example; a picture of a shadow – clue; 'these are dark and come out when the sun is out, even the statue of Richard Grosvenor, the Second Marquess of Westminster has one'

Teachers notes

- Prompt children to think about both science and nature, e.g. reflections of the pond to describing the surrounding flora and fauna.

Curriculum links

- Using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.

Differentiation

This Activity offers scope to meet many curriculum outcomes in science depending on the direction the child takes it.

- Children could be placed in groups/ pairs to share ideas and inspire each other.
- A range of card sizes can be provided to suit the children's needs.
- Children can be encouraged to provide a minimum number of cards although can make more if they wish.
